Social Sciences Experiential Learning in Action (SOSC3006) / GE Capstone course (GCAP3146)

Semester 1, AY2023/24

What is the course about?

This Experiential Learning course aims to enrich students' awareness of and respect for the diversity of cultures and people across the globe. Students are required to engage in **4+ weeks (or equivalent) of non-local experiential learning activity(ies)**. They are expected to spend roughly **120 hours** (6 hours per day, 30 hours per week), and the total workload may include the time spent on field trips/visits, services, research and data collection, conferences, workshops, seminars, lectures, tutorials, assignments/reports, etc. Through the non-local outreach experience, students are expected to develop global perspectives on various social, political, economic, and environmental issues across different cultures and geographical regions.

Students are required to initiate their own global outreach activities (physical or virtual) on either an individual or a group basis (maximum 5 students). Proposal of the self-initiated global outreach activity(ies) will be vetted by the Faculty.

Non-local experiential learning activities may include but not limited to the following:

- Voluntary/humanitarian work/community projects/service programmes organised by NGOs
- Summer school programmes or short courses offered by overseas universities
- Overseas conferences/seminars/workshops
- Overseas field-work or attachments
- Overseas internship or short exchange programme

Remarks:

- To avoid the double-counting of credit units of the same non-local activity(ies), the following situations are <u>NOT accepted</u>:
 - Participating in a non-local internship/attachment which is registered for and counted as the coursework requirement of another course offered by HKBU
 - Transfer of credit units from a course taken overseas, which is counted as the non-local activity(ies) of SOSC3006/GCAP3146 Global Outreach, to another course offered by HKBU
- 2. To minimise the effect of sudden changes on students' Global Outreach activity(ies) plan, students should provide a **contingency plan** addressing the following potential situations:
 - The non-local experiential activity(ies) may change to virtual mode
 - The activity(ies) may be cancelled

Social Issues

Through non-local outreach experience, students are guided to address the **social issue(s)** identified in the following areas:

- Environmental and Urban Systems
 (e.g. Environmental Conservation and Sustainable Development, Urban Renewal)
- Populations and Well-being

 (e.g. Public Health, Child & Youth Development, Social Welfare, Education Needs, Ageing,
 Gender, Ethnicity and Equal Opportunities, Social Inequity, Human Rights)
- Learning, Praxis and Governance
 (e.g. Cultural Diversity, Heritage and Community Collective Memory, Political Governance)

When will the global outreach activity(ies) be taken place for Semester 1, AY2023/24?

• Between 1 June 2023 to 30 November 2023

Remarks:

- 1. Students have to engage in 4+ weeks (120 hours) of non-local experiential learning activity(ies) within the period.
- 2. Students will be enrolled in the course in Semester 1, AY2023/24.
- 3. If the activities go beyond 30 November 2023 under unpredictable situation, the course assessment will be postponed to Semester 2, AY2023/24 and "I (Incomplete)" grade will be temporarily recorded in the grade record of Semester 1, AY2023/24.

Which course code should I choose?

The course titled "Global Outreach" is double-listed as two course types: **(1) Social Sciences Experiential Learning in Action** and **(2) GE Capstone** with two different course codes for respective groups of target students.

[Important Note for SOSC students]

As the two course codes (SOSC3006 vs GCAP3146) represent different course types, eligible students should pay attention to the course code they have enrolled after the confirmation of non-local experiential learning activity(ies) or release of course application result. Students are advised to plan ahead if they will apply for double-counting of GE Capstone towards SOSC ELA requirement so as to apply the course with the respective course code. They CANNOT change and register another course code after course enrolment.



Vetting

Your Proposal of Global Outreach Activity will be assessed by the vetting panel of the Faculty, according to the following criteria:

- 1. Provide **enough and detailed information/description** for the proposed non-local experiential learning activity in the 4+ weeks planner
- 2. Based on the information provided, the proposed non-local experiential learning activity is relevant to the social issue(s) that the student would like to address
- 3. Clearly describe **the benefit of the activity** on student's global outlook, and/or academic development, and/or personal development, and/or professional development, and/or other areas
- 4. Clearly describe the **action plans** to achieve learning objectives (*feasibility and ability* to undertake the activity will be considered)
- 5. Overall action plans of the proposed non-local experiential learning activity are **workable and achievable**

Shortlisted applicants may be invited to provide more details to facilitate the vetting process of proposed activities. Course application results will be notified by the Faculty via HKBU email.
